## **INSPIRING**

#### Sharing Environmental Successes

During the 2013-14 school year, the Alberta Emerald Foundation administered over \$20,000 for youth-targeted environmental projects. In total, the Youth Engagement Program distributed 63 Micro-Grants (grants worth \$300) and 32 Top-Up grants (grants worth \$100 that were awarded subsequent to a \$300 grant) for environmental initiatives in 23 Albertan cities and rural communities.

These initiatives include gardening and naturalization projects, environmental awareness programs, composting, recycling and waste management projects, scientific experiments of environmental issues, energy consumption monitoring programs, and field trips to zoos, outdoor classrooms, museums and other environmental education centers.

Altogether, **over 6,000 youth** were estimated to have participated in the environmental projects supported by our Youth Environmental Engagement Program.

This year, we continued our focus on sharing the good news environmental stories that emerge from the Emerald Awards through several initiatives. We continued our partnerships with Global Television and Shaw Television, who broadcast PSA commercials and also aired the Emerald Awards Show. We also grew our partnership with Postmedia, which saw a series of Finalist profiles run in the Calgary Herald and Edmonton Journal for seven weeks leading up to the Emerald Awards show. This partnership includes the creation of a micro-website to house all of the stories (from 2013 and 2014) as well as a social media campaign to promote the stories.

The Emerald Day program was evolving this year and the next Emerald Day event is scheduled to take place on Thursday, October 2 in Fort McMurray!

#### **Environmental Leaders**

This year saw a record number of Emerald Awards presented at the 23rd Annual Emerald Awards ceremony on June 5, 2014 in Calgary. Before the event, our panel of judges selected 34 finalists from the 96 nominees in the ten categories. We were delighted to welcome Hon. Robin Campbell, Minister of Environment and Sustainable Resource Development as well as Hon. Diana McQueen, Minister of Energy and Hon. Kyle Fawcett, Minister of Jobs, Skills, Training and Labour to join us in our sold-out event.
