Seeking to determine the most effective role it can play in supporting and encouraging youth involvement in environmental excellence, the Alberta Emerald Foundation conducted a series of interviews, surveys and stakeholder meetings that resulted in a report released in 2008 outlining opportunities for engaging Alberta's youth. The key message from the report was that Alberta needs more youth engagement in environmental action.

The Alberta Emerald Foundation is taking steps to engage youth in our province through several programs developed in 2008:

EMERALD INTERN PROGRAM

Thanks to funding from the Alberta Beverage Container Recycling Corporation and EPCOR, the Alberta Emerald Foundation was able to provide a training and learning experience for a post-secondary student. Through this employment and mentoring position, the Alberta Emerald Foundation was also able to build its capacity, providing a "winwin" situation.

YOUTH IN MEDIA

Enbridge is the first major sponsor to support a new Youth in Media program, which aims to reach youth throughout the province by sharing dynamic videos of Emerald Award nominated projects through the AEF website. Videos featuring the finalists from the 2008 Emerald Awards have been uploaded to the online searchable database, providing an enhanced experience for those individuals who wish to learn from these examples.

SCHOOL GRANTS PROGRAM

In an effort to support and encourage the grassroots examples of environmental excellence that are taking place at schools throughout the province, ConocoPhillips has partnered with the Alberta Emerald Foundation to administer a granting program to provide funding in recognition of the efforts of so many young people in our province.
