CALGARY, AB – Today, at Calgary's Eau Claire Market, hopeful nominees joined the Alberta Emerald Foundation (AEF), its sponsors, volunteers and other members from the local community, for the announcement of the 25th Annual Emerald Awards Finalists.

- Sharing Stories, a communication strategy that raises awareness of the Emerald Awards and its nominees, launched in 2011
- Launched Emerald Day program in 2012, with events in Grande Prairie, Red Deer, Camrose and Fort McMurray to date.
