In the last fiscal year, the COCC helped develop and approve the AEF's first formal strategic communication plan. ## Financial Committee

Despite Alberta's current economic climate, the AEF celebrated another successful financial year with contributions received in excess of \$500 thousand - an amount that is even more impressive as the Foundation did not receive any funding from one of their pillars, the Government of Alberta.

Next year, we will have a strong focus on cost control and diversifying our sponsorship base. The addition of a full-time Communications Manager in 2014-2015 also allowed us to bring several core activities of the Foundation in-house, as well as improved our advertising and outreach. The goal for the 2015-2016 budget is to be cash-flow neutral; however, in the event of a funding shortfall, our strong cash position will allow the AEF to maintain normal operations and will not impact the Emerald Awards 25th Anniversary.

## 24th Annual Emerald Awards

Albertans are passionate about balancing the development of our province's rich resources with environmental stewardship. The Emerald Awards, AEF's flagship program, recognize and celebrate outstanding environmental achievements across all sectors, including large and small business, individuals, not-for-profit associations, community groups, youth and governments. The Emerald Awards are the only awards program of their kind in Canada, inspiring environmental excellence in Alberta and beyond by showcasing the hard work and dedication of over 250 recipients and 400 finalists since 1992.

The 24th Annual Emerald Awards were presented on June 4, 2015 at the Citadel Theatre in Edmonton. The celebration, produced by volunteer Erin Newell-Lupien, was hosted by local theatre artists Jana O'Connor and Chris Bullough, and featured performances by award-winning Toy Guns Theatre and Nuella Charles, as well as Sturgeon County Choir and Poet Laureate Mary Pinkoski. The AEF shared the inspiring stories of the Emerald Awards through multiple cross-provincial media agreements, videos, social media, and website, as well as welcoming recipients and finalists to take part in 2015-16 Emerald Day events.

## Youth Environmental Engagement Grants (YEEG)

The AEF believes in inspiring the next generation of eco-heroes by supporting Alberta's youth in their environmental efforts. With funds from sponsors and individual donors, the AEF provides micro-grants of up to \$400 to youth-led and youth-targeted environmental projects across the province through the YEEG program.

YEEGs have been awarded to initiatives such as gardening and naturalization projects, environmental awareness programs, composting, recycling and waste management projects, scientific experiments focused on environmental issues, energy consumption monitoring programs, and field trips to zoos, outdoor classrooms, museums and other environmental education centres. This past fiscal year, the Alberta Emerald Foundation administered \$22,800 for 63 schools and 13 community groups in 26 communities across the province. The AEF also presented Junior Achievement of Northern Alberta and the Northwest Territories with the Ron Kruhlik Award at the 24th Annual Emerald Awards, recognizing the organization's outstanding commitment to developing environmental stewardship in youth with a \$1,000 cash prize.

In the upcoming year, the AEF is improving communications and recognition around the YEEG program, as well as collaborating with external granting programs to broaden engagement and awareness. The Alberta Emerald Foundation strives to allocate over 100 YEEGs this year.

## Emerald Day

Emerald Day events visit cities and towns across Alberta to share environmental success stories and to discuss the opportunities and challenges in each region. Thanks to funding partners from the hosting community, and our presenting sponsor Syncrude, Emerald Day events are free-of-charge for all participants and guests.

Emerald Day visited Fort McMurray's MacDonald Island Park on October 2, 2014, welcoming students and community members to gather for a day of learning. The day featured a Youth Event with special guest speaker Simon Jackson, and a community reception.

The AEF recently modified the Emerald Day format to appeal to families and the community at large. Beginning in the 2015-16 fiscal year, the AEF is piloting a program that includes a youth activity, trade show, Emerald Award Speaker Series and a showing of Disney/Pixar's timeless environmental classic WALL-E.
