For the first time in their almost-thirty year history, the prestigious Emerald Awards will be free and online for the entire province to attend.

The <u>29th Annual Emerald Awards</u> will take place online to celebrate our province's environmental achievements of nonprofits, businesses, governments, youth, and more. This year's <u>Shortlist</u>, chosen by a third-party judging panel of leading industry experts, highlights a diverse and impressive portfolio of environmental projects hailing from Calgary, Edmonton, Red Deer, Lethbridge, Cochrane, Lacombe, Airdrie, Lethbridge, Stettler, and Viking. For the first time, the AEF will be providing a grant to each category recipient to further their environmental work, thanks to the support of its sponsors.
