On June 6, 2024, we hosted the 33rd Annual Emerald Awards at the Calgary Central Library to celebrate and recognize the environmental achievements of the Emerald Award shortlist.

We were joined by numerous special guests including host Julian Faid, Indigenous artist Mackenzie Brown, Calgary Councillor Peter Demong, Deputy Minister of Environment and Protected Areas, Sherri Wilson, among many other municipal government officials from across the province.

The Emerald Youth Grant program empowers youth aged 5-25 across Alberta to take on environmental projects that inspire change and foster environmental stewardship



While the program was on pause AEF staff began the search for a new funding partner for this vital community resource. We're happy to report that as of January 2025 the program has received funding for the year from Pathways Alliance!

Inside Education's Regenerate Conference

On March 9, 2024 our Communications & Engagement Specialist, Sabrina, joined Inside Education's 13th Annual Youth summit as an expert guest. Together with Alberta Forest Product Association's Aspen Dudzic, Sabrina participated in a panel discussion about all things environmental communication, with a special focus on communicating science ideas through podcasting.

The Emerald Award Trophy

In 2024 we welcomed back the Emerald Award Trophy! In addition to being awarded a trophy, recipients received a\$1,500 grant, striking a balance between honoring past traditions and supporting future efforts.

Created by Calgary small business, ChopValue YYC, the 33rd Annual Emerald Award trophy was designed with sustainability top of mind. Using recycled chopsticks from local restaurants, each trophy diverted 680 chopsticks from landfills and stores 33 kg of Carbon Dioxide!









